Interview Skills with Hays

Devon County Show

This year we were delighted to be the Devon County Show official charity of the year!

We had a great show with staff, young people and supporters coming out in force to help us raise awareness and funds for Amber's work with young people locally.

As official charity we were gifted a stand plus a marquee and were the only charity allowed to collect around the show ground. We also attended the Stewards' and Stockmen's Suppers to speak to attendees about Amber's work with young people and to run fundraising raffles.

On top of this, Lakemoor Alpacas and Little Orchard Alpacas

fundraised for us by offering alpaca walks and a photo booth each lunchtime.

Pig farmers **WA and UG Uglow** also got involved, after hearing about Amber at the Stewards' Supper, and ran a hog roast for us the night before the show started.

Stewart Lee, who was at Amber 15 years ago, came along to help and talk about his time at our Devon centre and his recovery. He also sold copies of his recently published book 'Me and my Addiction'.

We were so pleased with the support we received from volunteers from long standing supporters **Crediton Boniface Rotary** who came out in force to help with collecting. Young people from Bythesea Lodge, Wiltshire, get out and about

Encouraging young people to be creative whether that is through art, music or writing is an important part of the Amber programme. It can often help young people process their past traumas, improve their self-esteem and support them be more hopeful about their future.

To inspire her team, Amber Team Leader Tracy, took a group of young people to Bristol to explore the city's amazing street art. Back at the centre, her team got to work on the redecoration of their team room updating



old furniture and making the room look bright and vibrant using spray paint. Tracy said, *"They learnt new skills and techniques....Wes was particularly good, I even let him spray a pair of my precious Docs!"*



Now that summer has arrived, young people at our Wiltshire centre have been busy trying out new hobbies. This month they visited **Melksham Rugby Club** with Support Worker Joe. They had a great evening meeting new people and learning new skills too. It is that time of year again! Our canal boat, **The Mary Rose**, is now back out and enabling young people to explore the beautiful Kennet and Avon Canal. This month, young people and staff from Bythesea Lodge in Trowbridge enjoyed a relaxing day on the narrow boat and gave it a much needed **'Spring Clean'**. In addition, a staff team from the centre successfully renewed their helmsman licences, so are all looking forward to many more trips out on the water this summer, where young people can enjoy and benefit from the peaceful surroundings.



Setting sail with Ocean Youth Trust

Amber has partnered with Ocean Youth Trust (OYT) for a number of years and young people from Amber had the fantastic opportunity to set sail again this year. Crew members work towards gaining a sailing qualification while learning team work and communication skills.

They set sail for Yarmouth on the first evening and then motor-sailed to Weymouth in light winds the next day. There was lots of sunshine and music and everyone had a chance to learn to steer and how to fill in the logbook, as well as taking part in hoisting sails.

On day three the young people did some training towards their sailing qualifications and then had a relatively short sail to Ringstead Bay for lunch, sailing back to Portland in the afternoon for a BBQ on Chesil Beach.

The final day was a really big sail, all the way round the south of the Isle of Wight to Cowes, where they saw another beautiful sunset and young people took a keen interest in learning about navigation buoys and cardinal marks as they passed.



We spoke with a few of the young people that went on voyage shortly after they got back on dry land. Luke, who is staying at Bythesea Lodge said,

"It was amazing. The best bit was the navigating at night, I really enjoyed it and felt like they really trusted me to do it. Working as a team all week and then to see it all coming together was great.

I can't wait to go back. They have invited me to do some volunteering work for them which includes some winter maintenance on the boat. If I had the chance, I would do it all again."

While James, staying at Amber's Ashley Court said,

"I feel really recharged – it is like the voyage reset me. It was amazing to see a different way of living and to travel and make new friends. Before Amber I lived in Torquay and I'd see these big boats in the harbour and thought they were only for really wealthy people. This experience has shown me there are opportunities available even if you aren't a





millionaire. I feel like I've got the beginnings of a specialist skill with my Competent Crew certificate."

Corran

Corran, 26, has now moved on from Amber's Wiltshire centre after finding a full time job at a large supermarket chain and securing accommodation.

A number of factors contributed to Corran finding himself homeless and on the streets.

"I left home when I was 17 and had always got on well at school but things started to get hard when I became a Dad. My ex-partner could not look after our Son so in the end I tried a father and baby placement in foster care. It was a really tough time in my life. I tried everything I could to keep custody of my little boy but in the end, it wasn't enough. To give him the life he deserved I agreed for him to be adopted."

After Corran's foster placement ended, he found himself without a home and completely broken.

"I had no tent, I just moved around with my suitcase at night, using it to lean against. In the day, I would go to friends' houses but I could never stay for any length of time. Sometimes I would be lucky and get a place for the night at a hostel; camp beds would be lined up in a church or village hall."

In 2022, the Council referred Corran to Amber.

"Phil, one of Amber's Team Leaders came to collect me. When I arrived I



was so relieved to have somewhere to stay, sharing a room didn't bother me at all. Thinking back, I didn't really speak much when I first arrived, I just kept myself to myself for the first couple of weeks.

The staff at Amber have been really supportive and have helped me to work through what I have gone through. The counselling that Amber offers has also made a big difference."

After engaging in Amber's programme of support, Corran is now ready to move on.

"After securing my job, I now want to focus on building a career for myself and keep moving forward with my life."

Abbey

Abbey, 23, moved on from Ashley Court, our centre in Devon, to a room in a shared flat.

Abbey came to Amber because she was fleeing an abusive relationship.

"I didn't feel like I had other options and I was in fear of my life."

A friend suggested Abbey reach out to Amber for somewhere to stay so she looked it up and referred herself.

"I was so nervous at the start. I did not think I would end up staying longer than a week. But I felt so safe there and everyone was so supportive."

Abbey spent 6 months at Ashley Court and in that time attended a range of workshops and sessions which she found really helpful.

"I feel I had a lot to improve on. The sessions were really relatable."

While at Amber, Abbey decided she wanted to work in the care industry. Since moving on, she has secured a job in a care home and has a flat of her own nearby.

Abbey is now looking to the future with hope.

"Amber saved my life – it genuinely did. I think I'd be dead if it wasn't for this place. Moving on does feel like a big achievement though and I am proud of myself but I wouldn't have done it without the positivity of everyone at Amber. I want to say the biggest thank you to them for supporting me and helping me get through everything I have! I will always cherish my time at Amber and be grateful for the amazing people I met."



Olly

Having started smoking and drinking at the age of just 10 years old, Olly found himself in a downward spiral in his late teens with addiction and homelessness. He spent a year on the streets in Sussex before coming to Farm Place in Surrey. That was when Olly decided to change:

"I never wanted to be homeless again and that's what ended up happening due to my using. There was a click and I gave up everything – I was done with it all. I knew something had to change and Amber was there to support me." Amber gave Olly stability and helped him to readjust to being around people without having to use drugs or drink. Amber supplied Olly with a laptop so he could attend courses online and he is now studying for his GCSEs as he left school at 13 without any qualifications. Whilst with Amber, Olly gained certificates through partnerships with VIY, Gasp Motor Project and Ocean Youth Trust. Olly suffers with anxiety, depression and PTSD but found the gym at Farm Place extremely beneficial:



"I've got quite an addictive personality, since I've got clean I use the gym to my advantage, it's a good thing to be obsessed with. At Amber you get what you put in. I had a lot f help with my mental health including talking therapies and on-site counselling, which has really helped me with my anger issues."

The support the Team Leaders gave Olly was life changing, he found that they were supportive, they became a trusted adult and helped Olly with his self-confidence. He also found the special activities such as bowling, rock climbing, kayaking and swimming really beneficial. Olly says:

"The activities are extremely valuable to the young people at Amber. A lot come from traumatic backgrounds and to go out into the world and feel safe, and do things – it shows you there's more to do in life than using drugs or drink or sitting around indoors. I'd never done archery, which was really fun. There are so many opportunities at Amber if you're willing to take them."

Olly is moving forward into a labouring job; eventually Olly would like to study mechanical engineering, once he gets his GCSEs. Although moving on is nerve-wracking for Olly, as he has spent the last 5 years homeless or in supported accommodation, he's also excited about all the possibilities that lie ahead for him:

"I can build my own life. Since being at Amber, I have the tools to build a successful foundation to move forward. I've made a lot of progress."

Ez

Ez, 19, hasn't had an easy start in life. Her relationship with her parents has always been volatile and she experienced abuse and neglect as a child. After she left school, Ez got as job as a bar tender but despite working all the shifts she could she was falling short every month to pay her parents rent. So, they kicked her out.

Unable to find anywhere affordable to live, Ez slept rough on the streets of Staines. Once homeless she also lost her job. *"I thought life ended when I was homeless."*

Ez then spent a month sleeping rough before the job centre referred her to Amber after she applied for Universal Credit. Within 2 hours, Ez found herself on a train heading for Farm Place, our centre in Surrey: "*it was a pinch me moment. I thought I was dreaming. I remember reading in an Amber leaflet you have to choose to transform your life, and I thought that's brilliant, I'll keep that in mind.*"

Despite Ez's traumatic childhood and upbringing, and being told she would not do anything or go anywhere, Ez found herself adjusting at Amber; "*it's a fantastic place for people who are at their lowest. Everyone is treated the same here, whether you've come straight from prison or been on the streets – everyone has a fair chance.*" Ez has learnt a lot from her Amber journey, along with the support of her peers and the staff: *"the staff here are the backbone of Amber, they go above and beyond and nothing is too much trouble. They help you even on their one-hour lunch break, which I learnt to appreciate. They always make you feel included, and if you have an issue and you talk to staff, you feel they've lifted the burden a bit and they try to help."*

While at Amber Ez attended weekly counselling which she found extremely beneficial; *"it feels like I can get everything off my chest, I can let it all out and a huge burden has been lifted. You feel comfortable talking and it's the one place you can speak and let it go in that room. If I didn't have counselling it would make me feel more shut in, and the longer you repress it you feel awful and feel like you're at breaking point."*

Ez put in a lot of hard work and effort with the support of Amber staff. It has now paid off as she has a new job as a housekeeper, with live-in accommodation provided. She is feeling ecstatic about living independently and sees this as a fresh start in her life; *"you have time to learn at Amber, there's no pressure and you can take it at your own pace. I've learnt that life will find a way, there's a continuation and it doesn't have to end with something bad."*
